



The Women's District of Columbia Golf Association was created in 1924 and exists for the purpose of promoting competitive amateur golf and conserving the best interests of women golfers.

The WDCGA consists of 30 member clubs and approximately 500 members. There are 27 scheduled tournaments and 3 junior tournaments.

Twenty- eight teams participate in team matches.

## HISTORY NOTE

The Women's District of Columbia Golf Association was created at a meeting held in March 1924, by a group of women who decided they would like to "paddle their own canoe". The idea to break away from the Men's Association was first conceived in June 1923, but actually making the break did not occur until 1924.

The first clubs were Chevy Chase (home of the first president, Mrs. Charles L. Frailey), Columbia, Indian Spring, Bannockburn and Washington Golf & Country Club. By the end of the 1920's the group included Argyle, Army War College (Army Navy Marine Corps Country Club), Beaver Dam (Woodmore), Belle Haven, Congressional, Kenwood, Manor, Town and Country (Woodmont), and two nine hole courses, Kirkside and Harper.

The first tournament under the auspices of the new group was held on April 28<sup>th</sup> 1924, at the Chevy Chase course. It was "most successful" with 25 entrants participating and a large majority of the WDCGA clubs being represented. Competition was 18 holes, match play against par, with handicap allowance. Par being 88, the first prize was won by Mrs. H. A. Knox from Indian Spring, whose medal score of 97 was the lowest and with a handicap of 10 she was 1 up on par.

# **MEMBERSHIP ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

## **Regular Member**

A woman golfer who:

- is at least 18 years of age
- is a member in good standing of a WDCGA member club
- belongs to a recognized women's golf association at that club
- has a handicap index within the specified WDCGA limits
- has at least 20 scores (active season) posted in the preceding 12 months
- The WDCGA follows the USGA gender policy.

## **Associate Member**

A woman golfer who:

- is a former member of the WDCGA
- meets the same criteria as a Regular Member but:
  - whose handicap is no longer within the specified WDCGA limits for participation
- Reverts to regular member status if her handicap meets the specified WDCGA limits

## **Honorary Membership**

- All past presidents of the WDCGA
- No other requirements.

# TOURNAMENT ELIGIBILITY

## **Regular Members**

A woman golfer who:

- is at least 18 years of age
- is a member in good standing of a WDCGA member club
- belongs to a recognized women's golf association at that club
- has a handicap index within the specified WDCGA limits
- has at least 20 scores (active season) posted in the preceding 12 months
- The WDCGA follows the USGA gender policy.

## **Associate Members**

- May play in Class D tournaments if the field is not oversubscribed.
- May play in any undersubscribed tournament(s) for which they are eligible.
- Must play to the WDCGA specified maximum handicap index.
- May compete for the cup and/or prizes.
- Afforded last priority in oversubscribed tournaments.

## **Honorary Members:**

- Honorary members whose handicaps are over the specified limit for a tournament may play under the parameters of Associate members.

## HANDICAP INFORMATION

### **Team Match Competition**

Players participating in this event shall use their preceding season's closing index (Maryland-November 15<sup>th</sup>, Virginia November 30<sup>th</sup>).

### **Posting of Scores**

All 9 and 18 hole rounds of golf played under USGA rules on a course with a USGA slope rating, shall be returned for handicap computation.

Member clubs are responsible for the validity of their players' handicaps. The WDCGA may disqualify a member from WDCGA-sponsored tournaments in the event of gross non-compliance with USGA handicap index rules.

A WDCGA member belonging to more than one club in the WDCGA shall designate one club to which her handicap revisions are to be reported. Unless otherwise indicated, that club shall be the club from which her application for WDCGA membership was received. However, if the handicaps differ between the clubs, the member must use the lowest handicap or be disqualified from competition.

## TOURNAMENT PROCEDURES

### **Registration**

- Each tournament has a specific entry form available at the back of this book.
- Entries shall be submitted by the individual player or team
- Entries shall be sent to the appropriate tournament chair (listed in the Tournament Schedule section at the front of this book).

- Mailed entries must be received by the designated deadline shown in the tournament schedule.
- Website registration may be available for some tournaments.

### **Late Entries**

Eligible players who miss the registration deadline may contact the appropriate tournament chair to be placed on a wait list.

A new member who misses the registration deadline (during her first month) may contact the appropriate tournament chair to be placed at the top of the wait list.

## **TOURNAMENT REGULATIONS & WDCGA CONDITIONS OF COMPETITION**

**Scoring** - A player shall exchange her scorecard with her fellow competitor. The players shall record each other's hole-by-hole score and sign the scorecard as the scorer. Each player shall sign her own card attesting to the correctness of her hole-by-hole score and handicap.

**Caddies** - Host clubs will provide caddies and/or golf carts. Participants are not permitted to bring caddies from another source unless otherwise authorized by the Committee.

Penalty: Disqualification

**Dress Code of WDCGA** - All attire (including shoes) must conform to the host club's dress code. In addition, blue denim jeans, short shorts, cut-offs, gym-shorts, sweat pants, tank tops, tee shirts, and swimwear are prohibited.

*The Rules and Decisions of the United States Golf Association shall govern play. See Notice to Players/competitors for additional Local Rules and Conditions. Unless otherwise noted, the penalty for breach of a Local Rule or Condition is: Match Play – Loss of Hole; Stroke Play – Two Strokes.*

**OUT OF BOUNDS:** Defined by inside points, at ground level, of large white stakes and fence posts. Rule 27-1

**WATER AND LATERAL WATER HAZARD STAKES AND LINES:** When both stakes and lines are used to indicate water and lateral water hazards, the stakes identify the hazard and the lines define the hazard margins.

**WATER HAZARDS:** Defined by yellow stakes or yellow lines. Rule 26-1

**LATERAL WATER HAZARDS:** Defined by red stakes or red lines. Rule 26-1

**ENVIRONMENTALLY SENSITIVE AREAS:** If such areas are present (usually identified by stakes with green tops), proceed as in Appendix I, Part B, of the Rules of Golf book.

**GROUND UNDER REPAIR:** Defined by white lines. French drains are deemed to be GUR, *even if not marked as such*. Rule 25-1.

**WHITE- LINED AREAS TYING INTO ARTIFICIALLY SURFACED ROADS AND PATHS –** have the same status as the roads and paths – obstructions.

**EMBEDDED BALL THROUGH THE GREEN:** Local Rule as prescribed in Appendix I, Part B, shall be in effect.

**UNDUE DELAY, SLOW PLAY:** See Rule 6-7, including Note 2 modifications for Stroke Play events. See WDCGA Pace of Play Policy page 91.

**INTEGRAL PARTS OF THE COURSE:** Includes cables, rods, wires or wrappings when closely attached to trees, liners in bunkers and artificial walls and pilings when located in hazards unless otherwise provided for in Notice to Players/competitors.

**DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES:** **The WDCGA allows a player to obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only. However, a player may not use a distance-measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect her play. See Rule 14-3 and Appendix I, Part B, 9 of the *Rules of Golf* book.**

**BALL DROPS:** **Ball drops may not be used unless they are specifically authorized by the local rule sheet.**

**LIST OF CONFORMING GOLF BALLS:** Only brands of golf balls on the current USGA list of Conforming Golf Balls may be used. Penalty: Disqualification

**TIME OF STARTING:** The Note under Rule 6-3 and optional Condition in Appendix I, Part C, of the *Rules of Golf* book shall be in effect.

**CELL PHONE POLICY:** Cell Phone policy - Electronic Devices may be used **in accordance with** the rules of the USGA (Decision

14-3/16) and any local club rule. However, electronic devices must be used only in the silent mode. Players should ensure that any electronic device taken onto the course does not distract other players or cause undue delay. Violation will result in a warning - continued violation will result in disqualification.

**DOUBT AS TO PROCEDURE:** A player may request assistance from any Rules Committee member. If help is not readily available in stroke play, the player may play a second ball in accordance with Rule 3-3. In Match Play, she shall proceed under Rule 2-5. Only members of the WDCGA Rules Committee are authorized to make rulings.

**DISCONTINUANCE OF PLAY:** The Note under Rule 6-8b and Optional condition in Appendix I, Part C, shall be in effect. Penalty: Disqualification. **Players have the right to stop play if they believe there is a danger from lightning. A player who discontinues play without specific permission from the committee MUST report to the committee as soon as practicable.** All practice areas shall be closed during suspension for a dangerous situation until the committee has declared them open. A player using such practice areas will be subject to a penalty of disqualification. Discontinue Play Immediately: One prolonged note of air horn. Discontinue Play: Three consecutive notes of air horn, repeated, Resume Play: Two short notes of air horn, repeated.

**SCORECARDS:** Scorecards may not be altered once they have been returned to the committee. Rule 6-6c.

**BREAKING OF TIES:** Generally, ties will be broken by a hole-by-hole playoff for first place and match of cards using the USGA

recommended method for other places. Refer to page 90 of the WDCGA Handbook for details.

**CLOSE OF COMPETITION:** The competition shall be deemed to have closed when the trophy has been presented to the winner or, in the absence of a prize ceremony, when the results have been officially announced.

## **MISC. TOURNAMENT INFORMATION**

### **Postponement of Scheduled Events**

All events will be played when scheduled unless the host club course is closed. Tournament Chairs shall suspend or postpone play to a future date, if conditions are deemed to be hazardous as defined in the USGA Rules of Golf.

### **Oversubscribed Tournaments**

When the field is oversubscribed, eligibility shall be determined by draw as follows:

- The defending cup winner is automatically exempt when eligible.
- WDCGA volunteers shall not be drawn out.
- Eligible members of the host club, whose handicap indexes are within the current WDCGA limit, shall not be drawn out.
- All other players with handicap indexes higher than the current WDCGA limit will be the first eliminated.
- No applicant whose handicap index is within the current limits shall be drawn out of more than one WDCGA tournament in any one year, if possible, provided previous elimination is stated on the entry blank.

## WDCGA COMPETITIONS

WDCGA competitions can be classified into the following five categories:

- **Team Match Competition** – Interclub competition played at the start of the season. Each club may field a team/s of 6 players and competes against other club teams of similar aggregate handicap.
- **Class Cup Tournaments** – Monthly stroke play competition that gives members an opportunity to play at member clubs and compete against players of similar ability.
- **Junior Girl's Golf Program** -This program is open to girls who have not yet reached their 18<sup>th</sup> birthday. Listed in this section is the Futures Cup, a mixer, which offers members an opportunity to compete with juniors. Junior girls from non-member clubs are welcome to play in WDCGA Junior events.
- **Added Fee Tournaments** – Popular events that offer a variety of venues, formats, and team or individual play.
- **Invitational Tournaments** – These events are invitation only and include the President's Cup which is our chance to thank our many volunteers.

The following sections describe these tournaments in greater detail.

## Team Match Competition

Our season kicks off with team matches held during April and May. Each team competes in a series of matches at away courses and hosts one match at their club. Member clubs form their teams well before the start of the season. See your club rep for details regarding eligibility or opportunities to be a sub. The last division may play fewer than six matches because that division may have fewer than seven teams.

## Class Cup Tournaments

**Eligibility:** Tournaments are divided into classes according to handicap indexes. Eligibility is adjusted to monthly handicap revisions. Except for a postponed tournament, a player may compete in only one Class tournament each month.

If the monthly index revision results in a change of class, a player whose class eligibility has changed is only eligible to play in the tournament of her new class-

**Format:** All class cup tournaments are individual stroke play.

**Postponed Tournament:** A registrant from the original field may participate in the rescheduled event, unless her index has dropped below that class handicap limit. In that event, she may not participate.

If her handicap index has risen above the handicap limit for that class, she may play using the maximum index allowed in the class.

Any player in the class who did not sign up for the original tournament may enter the postponed tournament.

## **Junior Girl's Golf Program**

*Please contact the Jr. Girl's Golf Chair for details about the "Junior only" events in this program.*

### **The Future's Cup**

*Member/Junior Girl Scramble*

**Eligibility:** This is a tournament in which a WDCGA Member and a junior girl (18 years of age and under) play as partners (nine hole event). Juniors do not have to be a member of WDCGA clubs. There is no entry fee and no formal application, but you must register with the Junior Golf Chair.

**Format:** Two-person scramble. This is an informal event, with the intent to promote the game of golf to junior girls. If you want to bring more than one junior golfer or if you do not have a junior golfer, but want to participate please contact the Junior Girls Chair.

## **Added-Fee Tournaments**

The tournaments in this section are subject to added entry fees as noted in the tournament schedule and on the entry forms.

- Fees include range balls and carts except for WDCGA Championships
- Caddie fees are not included.
- Make all checks payable to WDCGA and send to the appropriate Tournament Chair.

- Due to the popularity of these events, the field may be limited. Depending on the number of entries, two session events may be reduced to one session.
- There are **no refunds** after the closing date except when a player is drawn out.

## **District Championship**

**Eligibility:** This event is open to all members. However, the qualifying field may be limited.

**Format:** An 18-hole qualifying round, to reduce the field to 80 players, will precede match play. (No Refunds) All play is at gross.

The last flight must have at least 4 players. If there are less than 4 players then the players for that flight will be entered into the next highest flight by their qualifying score.

**Example:** 11 players, by handicap index, are eligible for the final flight. The top 8 players, by qualifying score, are taken and the remaining three are ineligible to play.

**Day One:** Qualifying Round (Stroke Play)

The Championship Chair will make the pairings for the qualifying round. The Defending Champion shall automatically qualify and will be seeded #1. If she elects to play for the medal prize, she shall be seeded according to her finish. If automatically qualified, she may play a practice round at the end of the field with a non-participant.

The Medalist and/or Co-Medalists if other than the Defending Champion shall be seeded #2 or #3 depending on their order of finish. There will be a Senior and/or Co-Senior Medalist (Metta Streit- 50 or over).

The top 16 qualifiers, which may include the Defending Champion, will comprise the Championship flight. The remaining qualifiers will be divided into flights according to their handicap indexes and seeded according to their qualifying scores.

**Ties in the Qualifying Round:** The last place in the championship flight and the last flight shall be resolved by a hole-by-hole playoff of stroke play at the completion of the qualifying round. Any player who is not present at the time of the playoff shall forfeit her rights. Ties in all other flights and for seeding positions in all flights shall be decided by the order in which scores are returned.

**Day Two:** All players in all flights play one match. Those players who lose their match in the championship flight will make up the 1<sup>st</sup> flight.

**Day Three:** Players in the championship and 1<sup>st</sup> flights play two matches. Players in all other flights play one match.

**Day Four:** Final Matches for all flights

**Finals:** The WDCGA Rules Chair, or her designee, shall act as the referee for the Championship flight final round. Members selected by the Rules Chair shall assist her as observers.

*NOTE: This tournament is one day of stroke play qualifying followed by match play in flights. Withdrawal or forfeiture by a*

*player any time after the qualifying round will be reviewed by the Committee (comprised of the Tournament Chair, the Championship Chair, the Rules Chair, the President and Vice President). If the Committee determines that the withdrawal or forfeiture was unwarranted, the player will be barred from playing in the Championship the following year.*

## **Senior Championship**

**Eligibility:** Entrants must be at least 50 years of age by the date of the tournament.

**Format:** This is a 2-day stroke play competition. The winner and runner up shall be the low gross scores of the entire field. There will be a Super Senior and/or a Co-Super Senior award for competitors 65 years of age and older. The field shall be divided into flights. Flight winners are the low gross scores in each flight. Net and gross prizes will be awarded within all flights. The Senior Tournament Chair will make the pairings for the first day of play. Pairings on the second day will be according to gross scores from the first day of competition.

## **Houlahan Cup**

**Eligibility:** Members who have a handicap index of 12.6 or above.

**Format:** This is a one-day stroke play competition. The field will be divided into flights. The overall winner shall be the low gross score of the field. Flight winners will be the low gross scorer in the flight.

## Kefer Cup

**Eligibility:** All players with handicap indexes of 12.5 or lower are eligible. Use of carts is restricted to those who have a medical excuse or are over the age of 65.

**Format:** This is a 2-day stroke play tournament as well as two daily tournaments. The Kefer Cup winner (trophy and TOC eligibility) is the low gross 2-day scorer of the field. Players may play in the 2-day tournament or either day, and be eligible to win 1 daily prize each day as well as a 2-day Tournament Prize.

## Pinehurst Stroke Play

**Eligibility:** Open to all members.

**Format:** This is a one-day stroke play competition in which both partners drive, and then each plays her partner's ball. After the second shots, partners select the ball with which they wish to score and play that ball alternately to complete the hole. The overall winner shall be the low net score of the field. This event usually has two sessions each of which is scored as a separate event.

**Handicap allowance:** the partner with the lower handicap receives 60% of her handicap at the host club; the partner with the higher course handicap receives 40%.

## **The Calomiris-Church Cup Mixed Four-Ball**

**Eligibility:** Open to all members. Male competitors (must be an amateur and at least 18 years of age) do not have to belong to a WDCGA club, however, they must have a USGA handicap. **Please verify that male partner's index is verifiable online based on the information you provide on the entry form – otherwise an alternate verification must be faxed/emailed to the tournament chair by specified deadline.**

**Format:** This is a one-day stroke play competition in which two competitors (one male/one female) play as partners, each playing his/her own ball. This tournament has both a net and gross winner. Ties are broken by the USGA recommended method. Although this event may have two sessions, it is scored as one event.

**Handicap allowance:** Women receive 95% of their host course handicap and men receive 90%. In addition, the player playing from the set of tees with the higher USGA Course Rating will receive additional stroke(s) equal to the difference between each USGA Course Rating (as outlined by USGA handicap rules).

## **Tony Marlowe Four-Ball Stroke Play**

**Eligibility:** Open to all members. Difference in partners' handicaps (using 100% at host club) shall not exceed 8 strokes. Those teams who have more than an 8 stroke difference in their host course handicap will have the higher handicap reduced so that their handicaps do not exceed 8 strokes.

**Format:** This is a one-day stroke play competition in which two competitors play as partners, each playing their own ball. The

overall winner shall be the low net score of the field. This event usually has two sessions each of which is scored as a separate event.

**Handicap allowance:** 95% of player's handicap at host course.

## **Verell Past President's Cup**

**Eligibility:** Open to all members.

**Format:** This is a one-day stroke play competition in which two competitors play as partners. Teams play 6 holes of four-ball stroke play (better-ball), 6 holes alternate shot and 6 holes captain's choice (scramble). The field will be flighted with gross and net prizes being awarded to the overall winners and flight winners. If the field warrants, this event will have an AM and PM session each being scored as a separate event.

**Handicap allowance: Convert index to course handicap. Four-ball** - 95%/3 of player's handicap rounded to the nearest stroke with strokes falling as they fall on those six holes. **Alternate shot** – 40%/3 of combined team handicap rounded to the nearest stroke with strokes falling as they fall on those six holes. Each partner's drive must be used at least two times on these six holes. **Scramble** – 35% of the low handicap golfer + 15% of the high handicap golfer divided by 3 and rounded to the nearest stroke with strokes falling as they fall on those six holes. Each partner's drive must be used at least two times on these six holes.

## **Invitational Tournaments**

*The following tournaments are by invitation only.*

### **Inter-City**

This is a one-day team match competition between the WDCGA and the WGA of Baltimore. A captain appointed by the President shall select a team of twelve players to compete in this tournament.

### **President's Plate**

**Eligibility:** The President shall send invitations to those who are eligible. The Executive Board, Committee Chairs and their Committees, Past Presidents, and those who have been of special assistance to the President are invited to attend.

**Format:** The President will decide the format and make the pairings. All participants shall be allowed to play for prizes.

### **Tournament of Champions**

This is a one-day stroke play tournament. The overall winner shall be the low net score of the field. The following current season winners are eligible:

- Winners of all WDCGA Tournaments
- Net and Gross winners of Added-Fee Tournaments
- Team Match Competition Division winners (regular team members – no subs)
- Winners of each flight in the WDCGA Championship and the Championship flight finalist
- Senior Championship winner and the Super Senior winner

- Club Champions and Senior Club Champions of WDCGA member clubs (must be members of the WDCGA)
- Past WDCGA Championship winners (must be members of the WDCGA)
- Defending Tournament of Champions winner

*There is no actual invitation sent for this event. Eligible participants may register on-line or send entries to the Tournament of Champions Chair.*

## **PRIZES & AWARDS**

### **General**

Prizes in WDCGA tournaments (except the Championships) shall be awarded at a ratio of 1 for every 4 players.

### **Class Cup Tournaments**

A minimum of 10 prizes shall be awarded at each Cup tournament regardless of the size of the field.

#### **Class A Cup Tournaments**

If the field is larger than 40 players, the additional prizes shall be:

- Gross for gross tournaments
- Net for net tournaments

#### **Gross Tournaments:**

Gross prizes awarded to the 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> place.

Net prizes awarded to the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> place.

#### **Net Tournaments:**

Net prizes awarded to the 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> place.

Gross prizes awarded to the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> place.

### **Class B, C, and D Cup Tournaments**

All tournaments and prizes are gross.

## **Championship**

Prizes in the Championship will be awarded to:

- Medalist and/or Co-Medalists in the qualifying round
- Metta Streit Senior Medalist and/or Co-Medalists in the qualifying round.
- Champion and runner-up
- Flight Winners and runners-up

## **Ties**

Ties for Cup winners and Tournament champions shall be resolved by a hole-by-hole playoff. If the playoff is for a net prize, the players shall receive strokes as they fall on the card with the number of strokes determined by the rules of the tournament. Once the winner is determined, a match of cards based on the USGA recommended method shall resolve the places of all other playoff participants.

Playoffs will begin immediately following completion of play. A player not present when the playoff begins shall forfeit her right to participate in the playoff.

A match of cards using the USGA recommended method should resolve all other ties. In the event the tie is not broken, the above procedure will be repeated using the front nine.

A player who loses a tie to win a net prize will not forfeit her right to a higher gross prize for which she is eligible. Conversely, a player who loses a tie to win a gross prize will not forfeit her right to a higher net prize for which she is eligible.

## PACE OF PLAY POLICY

Rule 6-7 stated, in part: “The player shall play without undue delay and in accordance with any pace of play guidelines which may be laid down by the committee,” and thereafter prescribes penalties for slow play. In order to prevent any such penalty, we suggest that you review carefully the following guidelines.

### DEFINITION OF “OUT OF POSITION”

The first group will be considered Out of Position if, at any time during the round, the group is proceeding at a pace in excess of an average of 14 minutes per hole for the holes that have been played.

Any following group will be considered out of position (RED FLAG) if it (a) is behind the prescribed schedule (14 minutes per hole) **AND** (b) reaches the tee of a par 3 hole and the preceding group has cleared the tee of the next hole, fails to clear the tee of a par 4 hole before the preceding group clears the putting green, or arrives at the tee of a par 5 hole when the preceding group is on the putting green.

**NOTE: Both (a) and (b) must apply for a group to be out of position.**

NOTE: 14 minutes per hole is the average time for 4 players playing in a stroke play event. Times will be adjusted according to event format and numbers in a group.

## MONITORING

Groups who are falling out of position may receive a warning *either* verbally or by use of a yellow flag. If a group is out of position (RED FLAG), the players in that group may be monitored and timed. Anytime a group is to be monitored and timed they will be notified of such timing by a Rules Rover, either verbally or by use of a red flag. The verbal notification by the Rules Rover will be made immediately after all players complete their tee shots on the hole where monitoring will begin.

Any player in a group out of position who takes more than **40 seconds** to play a stroke on one occasion will be informed as soon as practicable that she has a bad time. If she exceeds 40 seconds on more than one occasion (a total of two timings exceeding 40 seconds), she will be informed as soon as practicable that she has been penalized one stroke. If she exceeds 40 seconds on one more occasion (a total of three times exceeding 40 seconds), she will be informed as soon as practicable that she has been penalized an additional two strokes. Any player who takes more than 40 seconds to play a stroke on one more occasion (a total of four timings exceeding 40 seconds) will be informed as soon as practicable that she is disqualified.

NOTE: If the group in question regains its proper position, (WHITE FLAG) any previous timings of more than 40 seconds will be carried over for the remainder of that round in the event that group requires additional monitoring.

## TIMING

When a group is being monitored and timed each player in the group is expected to play any stroke within 40 seconds after timing of the player's stroke begins.

Other than on the putting green, the timing of a player's stroke will begin when she has had reasonable opportunity to reach her ball, it is her turn to play and she can play without interference or distraction. Time spent computing yardage will count as part of the time taken for the next stroke. On the putting green, timing will begin after a player has been allowed enough time to lift, clean and replace her ball, repair her ball mark and other ball marks on her line of putt and remove any loose impediments on her line of putt. Time spent looking at the line from beyond the hole/and or behind will count as part of the time taken for the next stroke.

NOTE: A player is permitted 40 seconds to play a stroke. An extra 10 seconds will be allowed for:

- (a) the first player to play a stroke on a par-3 hole
- (b) the first player to play a second stroke on a par-4 or par 5-hole
- (c) the first player to play a third stroke on a par-5 hole
- (d) the first player to play a stroke around the putting green
- (e) the first player to play a stroke on the putting green

NOTE: The Committee reserves the right, at any time, to time a group when the Committee deems it necessary. Players should also be aware that the Committee may assess a "bad time" to a player in a group which is out of position if the player makes no effort to help

her group get back in position. An example of this would be a player who delays between shots.

NOTE: If a ruling or some other legitimate delay occurs which causes the group in question to lose its position, that group is expected to regain its position within a reasonable time.

### **SUMMARY OF PENALTIES**

The following are the penalties, in sequence, for any player in a group being timed who takes more than the allotted time to play a stroke after timing of the player's stroke begins:

In the Pinehurst Stroke Play and the Alternate Shot and Captain's Choice formats of the Verell Past President's Cup, any penalty is assessed against the team and not the individual player.
